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SUBJECT: *Consider Actions Relating to Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Mayor and City Council are asked to consider resolutions to approve implementation of the Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative for the North River Drive and Riverview Circle sites.

BACKGROUND / KEY POINTS: In May of 2014, the Moorhead City Council approved the Moorhead River Corridor Master Plan. The Plan identified *Habitat Enhancement and Water Quality* as a key principal along the corridor. On February 23, 2015, the Moorhead City Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding with Audubon Dakota to implement the Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative on seven sites in Moorhead, including:

- 1. Oakport Prairie Site (*Property owned by the Buffalo-Red River Watershed District*)
- 2. North River Drive
- 3. Homestead Prairie
- 4. Riverfront Park
- 5. Horn Park
- 6. Riverview Circle
- 7. River Oaks

Goals of the Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative include:

- Habitat creation, enhancement and restoration, and
- Creating urban native prairie habitat areas that benefit birds and other wildlife, are aesthetically pleasing, allow for community recreational and educational opportunities, increase flood resiliency and improve water filtration.

Audubon Dakota, in partnership with the Fargo Park District, has initiated the Urban Woods and Prairies Initiative on six sites in Fargo. Audubon Dakota staff presented the Moorhead sites and information on the UW&P Initiative to the Moorhead Parks Advisory Board at their January 20, 2015 meeting and the PAB was supportive of the UW&P Initiative. The Watershed District is also supportive of the UW&P Initiative. Letters were sent to the neighbors of the N. River Dr. and Riverview Circle sites and the information was provided to staff at River Keepers. No comments have been received as of July 22.

Audubon Dakota has, through donations and sponsorships, obtained funding to proceed with implementation of prairie restoration at two sites: North River Drive and Riverview Circle South. Site restoration terms include:

- \rightarrow **Audubon** will prepare a restoration site plan for each site (see attached).
- \rightarrow Site preparation will be completed by the **City** (tilling, leveling, etc.).
- \rightarrow Plantings will not occur on the levee.
- → All site improvements (seeding, signage, plantings, etc.) noted within the site plans will be completed by **Audubon and Prairie Restorations, Inc.**
- → Audubon, with Prairie Restorations, Inc., will establish and maintain each site for a 3year period. This is the most critical period when establishing native restoration sites.
- → Following the 3-year establishment period, site maintenance will be completed by the City. Audubon will provide site specific maintenance and management plans for the City to utilize.

- \rightarrow **Audubon** may sponsor outdoor education programming at the sites.
- \rightarrow The **City** retains the right to add amenities to the sites.
- → The sites are within the floodplain and subject to flooding. Neither party shall be held liable for loss or damage incurred.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

- Site preparation will be completed by the City of Moorhead and is included within the approved 2015 Capital Improvement Budget.
- Site enhancements, as outlined in the approved site plans, will be completed by Audubon and Prairie Restorations, Inc. In addition to the proposed prairie and grassland planting areas, Audubon Dakota will also preserve and manage the existing wooded areas (debris removal, buckthorn control, etc.).
- Although natural resource restoration may require larger investments at the start, cost savings are recognized in the long term compared to mowing grass.

VOTING REQUIREMENTS: Majority of Quorum

Disclaimer: Voting requirements may be subject to changes in the law, parliamentary procedural matters, or other unforeseen issues. The City Attorney provides opinion on questions of voting requirements in accordance with the Moorhead City Code, Minnesota State Statues, and parliamentary procedure.

URBAN WOODS AND PRAIRIES INITIATIVE: ESTABLISHMENT PROTOCOL

Site Preparation

- 1. The project area will be fine graded before the seeding work begins (to be done by the general contractor or excavator).
- 2. Mow the existing vegetation, preferably with a sickle or flail type mower, to a height of 4" to 6".
- 3. In fall, apply a glyphosate herbicide (Roundup® or equivalent) and a triclopyr herbicide (Garlon 3A® or equivalent) with the appropriate surfactants, as per manufacturer's directions, to the actively growing vegetation in the project area. Site preparation will resume the following spring.
- 4. Disk or till the soil to stimulate weed seed germination.
- 5. Harrow or cultipacker the soil to create a smooth seedbed.
- 6. Respray with a glyphosate herbiced (Roundup® or equivalent) when regrowth of vegetation occurs and when it reaches approximately 8" to 12" in height.

Seed and Seeding

- 1. Seeding dates will be in the spring or summer before August 10th or in the fall between September 20th and freeze-up.
- 2. As a means to stabilize the site, the project area will be planted with native grasses only.
- 3. All grass seed will be applied with a seed drill designed for native seeding (Truax® or equivalent).
- 4. Wildflower seed could be applied by broadcasting after a prescribed burn at the beginning of the 3rd growing season.
- 5. The seed mixes will consist of the following species and amounts:

Management

- 1. Management (maintenance) plays a vital role in the eventual success of any native landscape installation, especially during the establishment period.
- 2. During the first growing season the project area may need to be mowed to control annual weed development. If a "closed canopy of weed cover develops, it should be mowed to aid in the growth of the prairie seedlings by reducing competition. Mowing may also be necessary if the weeds are about to set seed. Optimum cutting height, depending on the wildflower species present, is typically 4" to 6".
- 3. In years following the first growing season, management services should include site monitoring, prescribed burning, mowing, spot spraying, spot mowing, herbicide wicking or hand weeding.
