Moorhead Police Athletics and Activities League

In 2019, Moorhead Police Athletics and Activities League (PAL) helped 780 kids by providing opportunities for them to have one-on-one contact with law enforcement officers. Through programs such as Shop-with-a-Cop, Cops and Kids hockey game, bike donations and more, PAL looks for ways to have positive impacts with community youth. PAL's goal is to provide a positive influence, to empower relationships and reduce juvenile crime. Over 85% of officer time is donated off-shift and the remaining time is donated by the Moorhead Police Department. PAL believes that these positive interactions will not only help kids in high risk and disadvantaged situations, but the officers as well.
