To The Honorable Mayor and Members of The City Council Moorhead, Minnesota

Dear Council Members:

The 1975 Fire Department Annual Report represents the combined efforts and cooperation of all members of the Department.

The fire loss for 1975 amounted to \$266,540.00, an increase of \$141,805.00 over the previous year. This increase was primarily due to one fire loss of \$101,000.00 that occured at the Eastgate Apartment Complex, located at 1615 20th. Street South. The number of Fire Alarms answered in 1975 was 322, an increase of 13% over 1974.

One civilian lost her life, because of fire in 1975. She was Mrs. Gladys Horn of 415 North 16th. Street.

Some of the high-lites of the past year are as follows:

- .a. Chief Anderson completed the Dale Carnegie Course in effective speaking and human relations.
- b. Ass't. Chief Kelsven completed a course at the State Advance Driving School.
- c.Chief and Ass't. Chief attended the Fire Department Instructors Conference.
- d. Council approved changing to the emergency telephone number 911, to go into operation in 1976.
- e. Voters approved a Manpower Referendum of \$250,000.00 for more Fire and Police personal, by a three to one margin. (our thanks)
- f. Attended the Minnesota State Fire Department Convention held in Minneapolis. We were successful in our bid to hold the 1978 State Convention in Moorhead.
- g. We were very active during the Fargo-Moorhead Centennial Celebration, and helped sponsor, along with the Fargo Fire Department, a Parade and Fire Department Tourment.

- h. 36 hours were spend during the flood emergency pumping out of the sanitary sewers with two 1000 gpm Pumpers.
- i. Put our new Radio Pagers into service July 1st. They have been working very satisfactorily and we have been averaging about 70% in call backs.
- j. Appointed six new men to the Fire Department on July 15th. They are Albert Brandvik, Terry Beach, Daryl Hendricksen, Mike Saulsbury, Tom Schons, and Carroll Simpson.
- k. Chief Anderson attended the International Fire Chief's Conference.
- 1. Chief Anderson taught class in Fire Fighting Tactics at the State Sectional Fire Schools
- m. State of Minnesota adopted the Minnesota Uniform Fire Code.
- n. Visited some Twin Cities Fire Departments and made a report to the Public Safety Committee.
- o. Made a request to the Insurance Service Office for a Rating Survey in 1976, with the hope of obtaining a more favorable Insurance Classification.

This report also conveys Thank You to Mayor Hoberg and the City Council, and a special Thank You to the members of the Public Safety Committee, for their help and direction they have given to me and the department, in the past year.

#### TRAINING REPORT 1975

In 1975 our department totaled 606 hours of instructions in the form of evolutions and class-room training. This training was given to each of our three shifts, therefore each shift received around 202 hours of instruction. The break down of this instruction is as follows:

The 606 hours shown here are actual hours of training, to arrive at man hours we have 10 men on each shift, therefore we would have around 6,060 man hours of training. This report does not take into consideration the on the job training given by each officer

Besides this training the men spend time on maintanence and upkeep of the fire stations and the apparatus housed in them, along with testing and checking our fire hydrants.

This is the first complete year the Fire Prevention Bureau has operated out of the Fire Department under the Chief, Assistant Chief and myself.

I feel that progress has been made in the inspection field. During the year 1974 there were 594 violations compared to 393 this year. Corrections made in 1974 were 231 as compared to 307 during 1975. We have worked closely with the Codes Dept. on new construction and remodeling of existing buildings. On most Tuesday mornings, we meet at City Hall to check plans and discuss current and future problems.

During Fire Prevention week, a film was shown and materials distributed to approx.

1600 Elementary students in grades four through six. The VFW Auxiliary donated \$300 toward the purchase of these materials. Each year we hope to broaden the fire safety concept in the schools.

In October, one man from each shift was put on Fire Prevention during the work day. This has proven to be an asset to the Bureau; however these men are not always available to leave because of Fire Department duties around the station.

I have attended a number of meetings and schools this year and as a result felt a growth in both personal and professional knowledge. The information brought back from the Arson School at Lincoln, Nebraska has aided me in local fire and arson investigations. Two other sessions that proved to be beneficial were a 3 day Seminar on Uniform Building Codes, and a 30 hour 3 credit course at MSU on Uniform Building Code Field Inspection.

It is difficult to measure the total effect of Fire Prevention, but is is my opinion that this whole program begins with educating the children and continues to develop through field inspections with the authority to correct violations.






