The snow has disappeared for the second time this spring and we hope we won't see any more snowflakes until next winter! Normally, weather is our only enemy when it comes to golf, but for the first time in our history, a majority of courses around the world are dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Meadows and Village Green courses will open on May 4, unless the Governor's order is extended. The health and safety of our community and staff is our main priority during this uncertain time.

The more we cooperate with social distancing measures, the safer we will be as a community. Moorhead golf is working closely with other local facilities to maintain consistent safety procedures between courses. Things may look and operate differently than we are accustomed to during the 2020 season.

Both clubhouses remain closed to the public until further notice; however, both golf shops are currently operational during normal business hours. Season passes can be purchased over the phone or online at <u>moorheadgolf.com</u>. We encourage golfers to purchase their season passes online to comply with social distancing guidelines. Current season pass sales are based on 181 days of open time (May 4 to October 31). Please note that if we are unable to open or courses are ordered by the state to close, pass holders will receive a pro-rated refund at the end of the season based on the number of operating days.

## FOOD AND BEVERAGE CHANGES

The food and beverage provider scheduled to serve our golf courses this summer have decided not to renew their agreement. The City is currently seeking proposals from qualified individuals or firms to provide this service once the Governor's order to suspend bar and restaurant service is lifted.

In the interim, the golf courses will offer food and beverage vending with a "grab and go" approach. Golf outings and tournaments will be serviced by a catering company when these activities are allowed to resume. Alcohol will not be sold or consumed on the course until a new vendor with the appropriate licensing is established.
