Gentlemen:

The past year found the department taking a more active part in Fire Prevention work and the rescue demonstrations given for the benefit of three local schools was an example of what the department can do to capture interest in Fire Prevention activities.

A steady improvement in the training of fireman has been noted during 1955 and the training program recently outlined to the firemen for 1956 stresses the necessity for repetition to make all duties of the fireman an automatic operation. The program not only includes Fire-fighting evolutions but First aid as well.

Three members of the department attended the Minnesota State Fire School the past year thus leaving only three firemen who have not yet attended. The chief attended the convention of the International Association of Fire Chiefs in Omaha last fall. All quarterly meet—ings of the Northwest Regional Firemen's Association were attended as well the Regional Fire School held at Fergus Falls.

Through the cooperation of the Mayor and City Council and much help from the City Attorney, the Moorhead Fire Department Relief Association was reorganised during 1955. The reorganisation makes possible the raising of Service pensions paid to fully paid Firemen through the assessment of 3% and firements salaries. Peter Jesten was retired shortly after the new plan was put into effect and is nw receiving a \$100.00 per month Service pension. The funds of the Relief Association have reached a record high even with the payment of Mr. Jesten's pension added to the list of pensioneers the fund continues to grow due to the assessments made against firemen's salaries.

This report conveys congratulations to all the new members of the City Council and extends a welcome to come and visit us so we may better explain the operations of the department and plans for the comming year.
